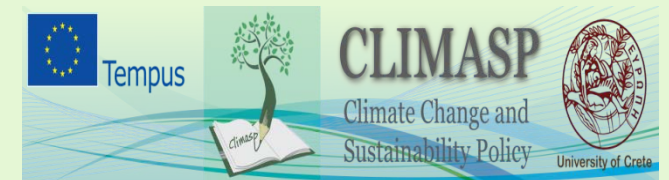

What is CLIMASP Project?

CLIMASP is a European Commission TEMPUS funded project entitled “Development of an Interdisciplinary Program in Climate Change and Sustainability Policy” that is being designed and implemented across 10 universities in Jordan, Egypt and Lebanon. The CLIMASP project is coordinated by the University of Crete, Greece through The UNESCO Chair on ICT in Education for Sustainable Development.

CLIMASP program gives the students the opportunity to earn a formal credential (Euro-ArabPass Diploma) in climate change and sustainability policy in addition to the bachelor’s degree granted within each specialty.

Main Objective

The main focus of the CLIMASP is to address the issue of climate change and sustainability policy from an environmental, social, economic, cultural and political perspective, with regional reference, through transforming the current unsustainable practices that prevent interdisciplinary collaboration and promote interdisciplinary curricula in the partner countries universities..
