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<b>Course Description</b>	<p>This course is designed for third and fourth year undergraduate students. This course provides an introduction to data warehouse design. Topics covered: data modelling, database design and database access are reviewed. Data extraction, cleansing, transformation and loading, data cube computation, materialized view selection, OLAP query processing, star schema, fact tables and dimension tables will be examined. Multi-dimensional databases are emphasised. Issues in data warehouse planning; design, implementation, and administration are discussed in a seminar format. The role of data warehouse in supporting Decision Support Systems (DSS) is also reviewed.</p>
